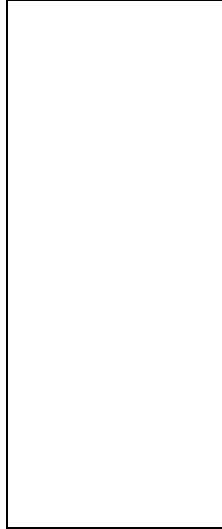

Every member will then receive a survey listing the various traits most desired in a Senior Minister. You will be invited to choose 12 of those traits you feel are most important in your next Senior Minister. each branch of military service will be played in a medley. If you, or a member of your family, have served this nation in that branch, you will be asked to stand as that hymn is being sung by the congregation.



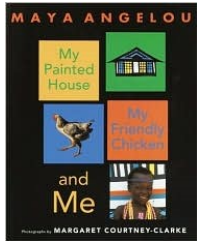

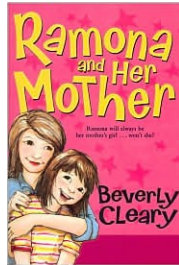

Since school is out, your Library would like to offer a few interesting books for our younger readers. **Maya Angelou's "My Painted House, My Friendly Chicken and Me"** takes us to Ndebele, South Africa where we meet Thandi, who lives with her mother, her aunt, her younger brother, and her best friend, a chicken. She is eight years old and Thandi tells us of her joys and challenges growing up between the modern world and the traditional world her mother is passing down to her. Even though **"My Painted House..."** is a quick read, you will learn so much about Thandi and her world. This book was donated by The Bishop Circle.

Ramona Quimby is seven and a half years old and relates the ups and downs of life in the Quimby family. **"Ramona and Her Mother" by Beverly Cleary**, is a "chapter book" for the younger set. You will hear Ramona's "trials" of life with her working mother, though not without humor. Feeling unloved, poor Ramona takes to twitching her nose like a bunny in a cute story book and her teacher becomes concerned. This book prefaces the recent family movie "Romana and Beezus" recently out in theaters and now on DVD.



If you are taking a trip to the "Bridge" this summer, **Gloria Whelan's "Mackinac Bridge"** would be a good read before seeing the real thing! Young Mark and his dad, Captain Hansen, a ferryboat captain, worked the ferryboat rides across the Straits of Mackinac for as long as Mark can remember.
