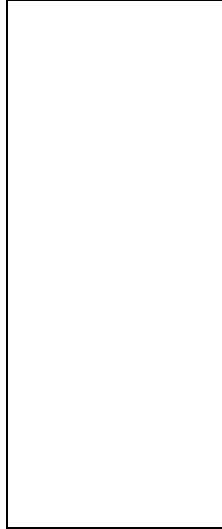

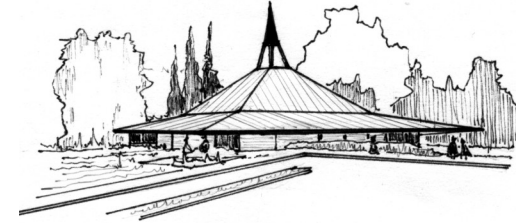

## CEMETERY PLOTS AVAILABLE

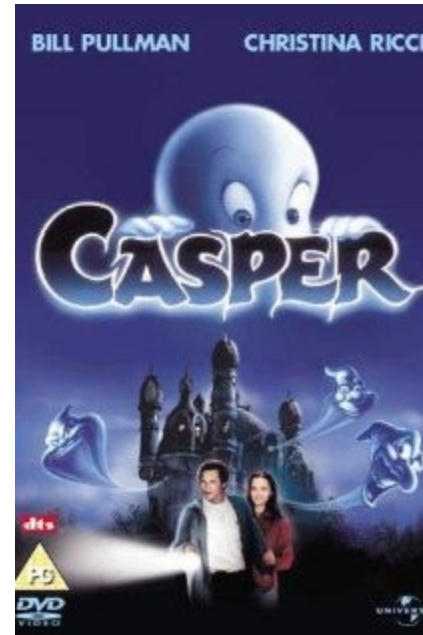

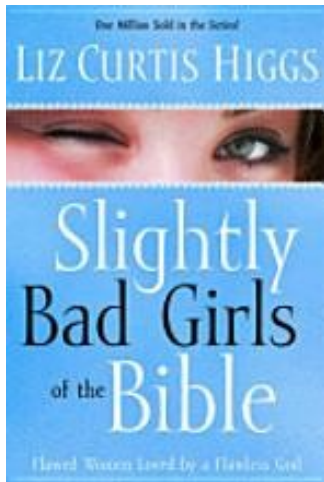
# Casper

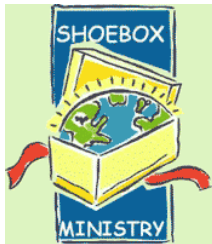

We are making a commitment to our friends at the Greater Lansing Food Bank. They have put out a call for help after one of their 3 refrigeration trucks was destroyed in a senseless act of vandalism. We are selling water and other refreshments at the Plymouth Concert Series. That \$1 you spend on a bottle of water is going directly to the Food Bank to help defray the costs associated with purchasing another vehicle. Our first concert saw us earning \$100! [the heat is good for SOME things!!!] So, keep coming to the concerts, tell your friends and keep drinking! [the water that is!]

Samaritan's Purse is a constant and quiet presence wherever Christ is needed in our conflicted world. They are asking us to pray. We can do that. They are currently focusing on rebuilding 300 homes in Japan that were flooded but the foundations are intact. They have provided over 3,000 displaced families with household kits.

There are several part time security positions open at the Maplewood Shelter for Women and Children. Candidates must be detail oriented and able to sit or stand for long periods of time. The job entails surveillance of the security cameras, making periodic rounds of the building, and ensuring the safety of those whom the mission serves. # STEWARDSHIP ASSOCIATION PLANS

(Delivered by Rev. Baumgartner)

Several months ago at a Positive Vision Committee meeting, we discussed needs of the congregation. The members of this committee are a true blessing as they represent every aspect of church membership – oldest and with the most tenure to youngest and newest members. Like our at-large council members, they keep their eyes and ears to the heart of the congregation, looking for new ideas for ministry to build the Kingdom of God.

One of the issues that arose was the feeling of some newer members that long time members with a history even at the downtown church felt less included and of less value at times. Many long time members made a point of prefacing their input at meetings with their length of membership, and those newer members felt that perhaps they then had less influence.

We began to explore patterns of church membership over the years and realized that as with churches all over the country, church membership in larger churches had often fallen and perhaps it had to do with attitude and a lack of a sense of belonging even more than pastoral or congregational leadership.

Rex Sessions sits on that committee and actually named the committee! Rex shared with us the meaning of many of the symbols in the church and gave us a history of building the new facility – how decisions were made and what went into that great effort. We were so impressed that I asked Rex if he would be willing to share that information with the congregation on a Sunday morning so that everyone might have an opportunity to know the history and feel a sense of belonging and a sense of ownership in this great church we call Plymouth Congregational.

As the Trustees began to plan the challenge of stewardship for the congregation this year, I recognized that the church sits at the precipice of a new day. We've accomplished so much during the past year and tried to live within a tight budget, but it is clear that we have to unite as a congregation and we must take a leap of faith. We have to work together toward a common goal of doing the work of Christ.

While Rex is here this morning to help us feel part of this great church – past, present and future, we must focus our energies and our hearts to look outward rather than inward.

Both Helen and Debbie attended the national conference in June with Rev. Baumgartner and are delighted to serve in this capacity.

Along with attending the corporate meeting, Helen, Debbie and Joy attended various workshops offered during the conference days. Helen and Joy attended the workshop focused on the resources available through the National Association for churches searching for a minister. The session was a helpful refresher on the valuable assistance available to our church, including the assistance with church profile preparation, advertising and receiving profiles from ministerial candidates. They returned with resources for our search committee who will meet with a representative of the NA.

The Rev. Barry Szymanski offered a wonderful workshop attended by Rev. Baumgartner which focused on training and working with volunteers and dealing with conflict within decision making bodies in the church. Debbie attended a workshop on music and brought home many resources and will be working with John Dale Smith and others in our music program to bring new and fresh perspectives to music in the church.

All in all, the conference was a great success, with the Strategic Plan being accepted overwhelmingly by the conference attendees. The Committee now continues to “put flesh on the bones” and will continue to receive input from our churches as they design an effective and meaningful strategy for our churches to work together, play together and pray together. Please keep our National Association staff and leaders in your prayers as they continue this process, and celebrate with Debra and Helen, who have been elected by our Church Council to serve as our representatives to the National Association for this year.

# NATIONAL ASSOCIATION MESSAGE

(partner October 16, 2011)

The most essential and exciting part of the National Association meeting this summer was the debate over the new STRATEGIC PLAN. A committee had been formed in 2010 to formulate a plan of action to strengthen member churches and to help churches in the National Association to be better connected, thus strengthening the entire organization.

The proposal involves three components: **Congregational Growth**, which includes bringing more churches into the NA and empowering youth leadership within the churches; **Congregational Vitality** including ministry development and support, assistance with the pastoral search process, stewardship resources and assistance, and assistance for churches in developing their own strategic plans; and **Congregational Outreach** including involvement in local, national and international missions, and nurturing relationships with other religious organizations.

This plan gives much more flexibility to the NA in terms of services available to member churches and the plan proposes a reduction of the number of people in the leadership team and at the same time engages more people in our local congregations in delivering services by utilizing non-staff resources. In other words, churches will be assisting other churches, instead of depending on the national staff to provide resources and assistance.

The goal is to maintain a line of communication with member churches throughout the year. Each church will choose one or two delegates who are able to share ideas or issues of concern from their congregations and also keep their churches informed of news and activities occurring in the National Association. **Our Church Council has elected Debra Hoyt Hawkins and Helen Elliott to act as our delegates for this year.**

While we sit in this beautiful Centrum with stained glass, gold crosses and candelabra and altar paraments, we are surrounded by families who live day to day, hoping and praying that they will be able to feed their children just one nutritious meal a day or keep a roof over their heads for one more month.

Each year, we begin this stewardship time by talking about OUR needs and of course that means providing this facility and staff, looking at our costs of doing Christ's work. We have to be practical. But I believe we're going about this all wrong. David asked the right question last week in his sermon: "Is what we're doing building the Kingdom of God?" If we intend to do that, what will it look like? That is the premise behind the Positive Vision Committee. What ideas can we generate that will assist each ministry do the work of Christ?

As we begin to look closely at the gift we will present to God this year through our Church, I believe we must seriously go to our God first and ask God what portion of all we have been given should be shared? If the gifts are for God, shouldn't God be involved in our decision? If we are going to represent Christ in the world, then all this beauty is but a reminder of God's grace and generosity, isn't it?

We are a congregation made up of new and old members, young and aged, happy and sad, conservative and liberal, traditional and new age. But we are a family! Today we begin the process of deciding – making a promise to support the ministry of Christ through our Church. These are faith promises – witnesses to our faith and love for God.

We have an opportunity to pledge our support to bring a new pastor into this family, to educate and bring music into the lives of our children, to give to others that we might make a difference in the world around us rather than be insulated and isolated. We have a chance to move into the future as a healthy, giving and loving Church.

As we sit prayerfully and carefully with our faith promise cards, my hope is that we will focus first on Christ and Christ's call to ministry. Building Christ's Kingdom must always come first.
